

The CODE of the C.I.A.

I myself am convinced, my brothers, that you yourselves are full of goodness, complete in knowledge and competent to instruct one another.
(NIV) Romans 15:14

1. Honor the King with your life. Swear allegiance to Him and to Him only.

(If you are a Christian, you **VOLUNTARILY** gave up your life for the One who gave His. You are to live that life in a way that honors God. Not just on Sunday's. Therefore, we swear our allegiance to God, we pledge allegiance to our flag and swear to never give ourselves to Satan, the enemy.)

***1 Corinthians 6:20** For you were bought at a price; therefore glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God's.*

2. Serve the King in truth, justice and honor.

(To serve the King, you must commit yourself to His standards. Truth in your words, justice in your judgments' against others and honor that gives the King glory as you bear his seal. Service is your new calling)

***Romans 12:1-2** I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service. **2** And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God.*

3. Offer compassion to the weak, the destitute, the widowed, and the poor.

(We were made to be men for a purpose. To protect those who can not protect themselves. The strong should protect the weak and the large protect the small. That God's light of hope would shine through you in a dark time. That a widow would never go without protection or help and that those with little, would be given more.)

***Zechariah 7: 9-10** "Thus says the LORD of hosts:*

' Execute true justice,

Show mercy and compassion

Everyone to his brother.

***10** Do not oppress the widow or the fatherless,*

The alien or the poor.

Let none of you plan evil in his heart

Against his brother.'

4. Live for the King and serve others without cause for personal gain.

(If you should choose to take the oath of The Code, you do so for the pure purpose of service to the King and His people. Putting aside pride, self righteousness, arrogance and greed.)

***Galatians 5:13** For you, brethren, have been called to liberty; only do not use liberty as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another.*

5. Never abandon a fellow knight in battle or in peril.

(In battle, every man will fight and every man will be wounded at some time. You are to stand by that brother, so as he will never feel alone. In times of weakness, a brother will be in peril. YOU WILL NOT leave that man, for fear of sacrificing each and every aspect of the code which you have sworn to uphold.)

***1 Peter 5: 8-9** Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil walks about like a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour. 9 Resist him, steadfast in the faith, knowing that the same sufferings are experienced by your brotherhood in the world.*

6. Equip, train and prepare for battle against the forces of the Dark Knight (Satan).

(If your sword was measured 1” for every verse you had memorized, how long would it be? If the strength of your sword was the depth of your faith, would it break, bend or stand strong? If your strength was measured by your time in prayer, would you be weak or strong?)

***Ephesians 6: 10-13** Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might. 11 Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. 12 For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places. 13 Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand.*

7. Serve the King and faint not in the day of battle.

(You may be called to battle or it may come to you, but it will come. Go to war with the expectation of victory and do not stop till it is achieved. For we have been told by the King, that every battle we can win. Conquering the enemy or fleeing to safety are both victories.)

***1 Corinthians 10:12-13** Therefore let him who thinks he stands take heed lest he fall. 13 No temptation has overtaken you except such as is common to man; but God is faithful, who will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able, but with the temptation will also make the way of escape, that you may be able to bear it.*

8. Use the sword not to seek selfish gain, but rather to execute justice and the will of the King.

(Your position in the kingdom is not for your glory, reputation or prestige, but for God. You are called to be firm but fair, admit mistakes and be righteous in ALL your dealings.)

***1 Timothy 2: 1-3** Therefore I exhort first of all that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks be made for all men, 2 for kings and all who are in authority, that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and reverence. 3 For this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Savior.*

9. Be merciful, loyal, courageous, faithful and noble, but above all, be humble before the King and before men.

(Let those six words be who you are and not who you wish to be. That you do not only show these traits on Sunday mornings, but that they are who you are known as. So other men may not know your name, but your convictions, beliefs and character will be well known.)

***Titus 3: 1-2** Remind them to be subject to rulers and authorities, to obey, to be ready for every good work, 2 to speak evil of no one, to be peaceable, gentle, showing all humility to all men.*

10. Let your words always be spoken in truth.

(There is no time that a man must lie. For if you are known for always speaking the truth, then you will be respected for your honesty and integrity. If a man lies, the size of the lie does not matter. For he wounds himself and the code, which every brother has sworn an oath to.)

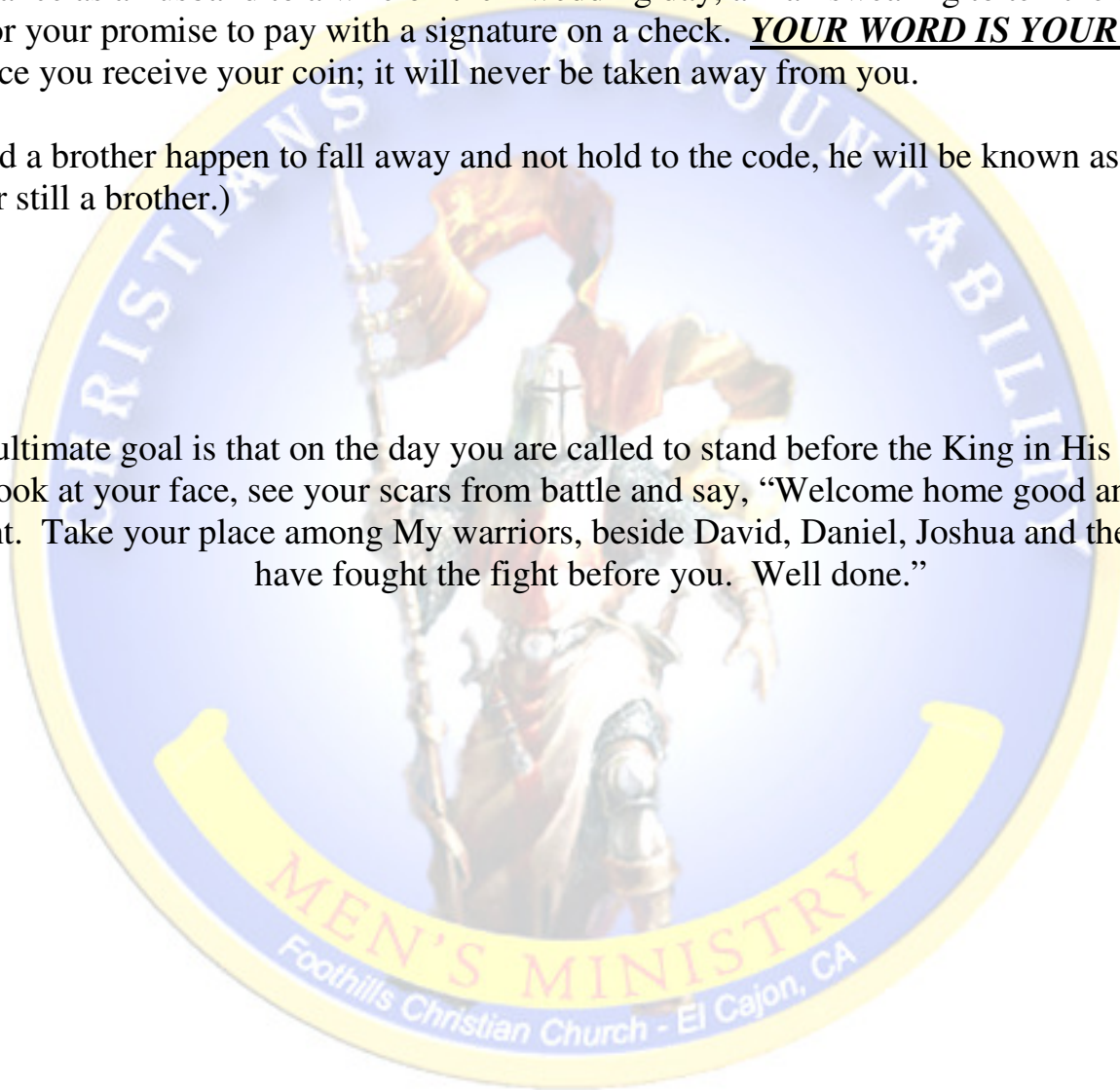
***Colossians 3: 8-10** But know you yourselves are to put off all these: anger, wrath, malice, blasphemy, filthy language out of your mouth. 9 Do not lie to one another, since you have put off the old man with his deeds, 10 and have put on the new man who is renewed in knowledge according to the image of Him who created him.*

Fellow brothers,

As you read these codes and study what they mean to you, also think about each and every man that has taken this same oath. Know that by taking this oath, you are not only committing yourself to each code, but to each and every man who has taken the code before you. You are stating that you are allowing fellow brothers to speak into your life if a concern or problem is viewed, that would disgrace the Church, Men's Ministry, or Christians In Accountability. You are taking this oath VOLUNTARILY and treating it with the same importance as a husband to a wife on their wedding day, a man swearing to tell the truth in court or your promise to pay with a signature on a check. **YOUR WORD IS YOUR BOND!!!** For once you receive your coin; it will never be taken away from you.

(Should a brother happen to fall away and not hold to the code, he will be known as lost, but forever still a brother.)

Our ultimate goal is that on the day you are called to stand before the King in His court, He will look at your face, see your scars from battle and say, "Welcome home good and faithful servant. Take your place among My warriors, beside David, Daniel, Joshua and the men who have fought the fight before you. Well done."
